Nursing is one of the nation’s top professions for projected job growth. More than one million new nurses will be needed by 2016.* Sign-on bonuses, scholarships and recruitment incentives make it an appealing career in today’s uncertain economy.

Five Connecticut Community Colleges offer a two-year Associate in Science Degree Program in Nursing:

- Three Rivers Community College, Norwich

You may apply to as many as three of our Colleges with one application. Long waitlists are eliminated. Our streamlined admission process allows accepted students to enter by the fall or spring of their application year. Most eligible applicants are accepted the first year they apply.

Our Nursing Program graduates are eligible to take the NCLEX-RN national exam that licenses Registered Nurses (RNs). Our graduates have some of the highest NCLEX-RN pass rates in the state.

In 2008, registered nurses in Connecticut earned an average of \$68,594/year. New graduate nurses earned an average of \$53,376/year.**
